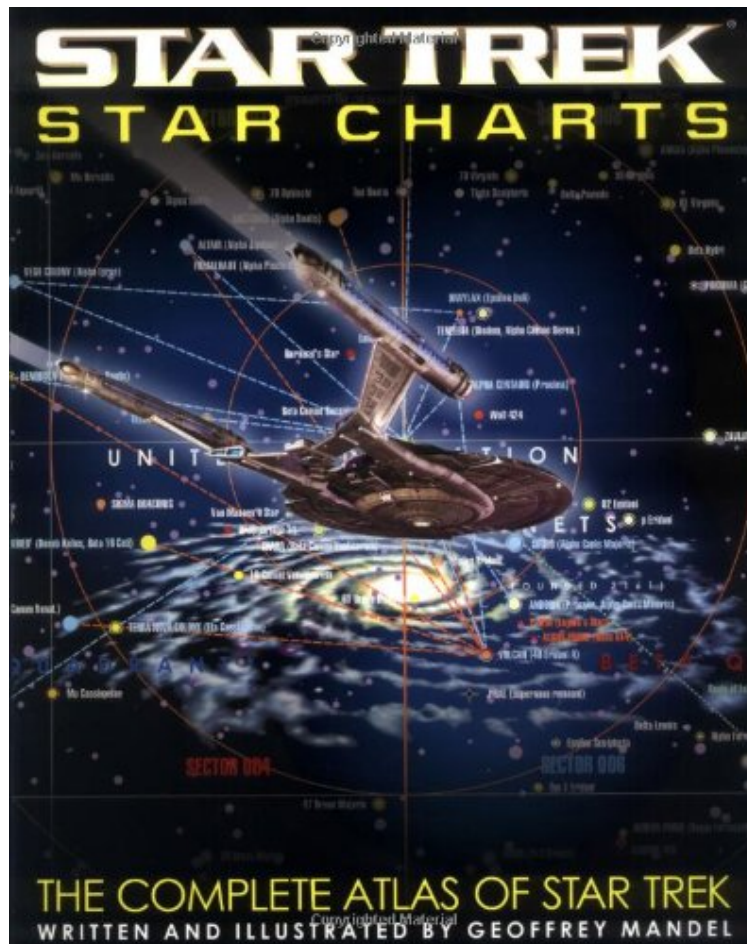

The art is excellent and the Voyager route home pages are great. But the book lacked a lot of detail. The section on how the quadrants/sectors are all divided up is cool. This is not a star chart guide as much as it is a galactic overview. It lacks a lot of detail.
