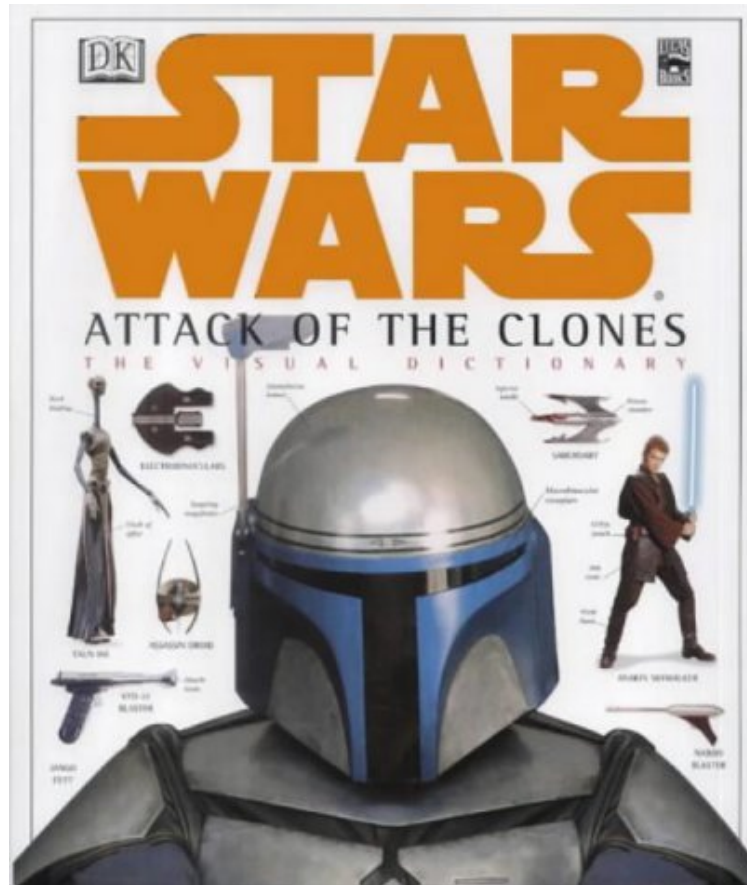

But it does contain some really great pictures to gawk at, and tantalizing source material- some of which was apparently cut out of Episode II. You get a look at a bunch of different Jedi and their fighting styles, Mandalorian armor, and the lowdown on what R2-D2 is packing in that little metallic barrel body of his.You also get some neat insight into the SW universe. For example, I didn't really catch the similarities between Jango Fett's armor and Clone Trooper armor before, but this book describes how clone armor was modeled on Mandalorian armor. You get some tidbits on who the Mandalorians were and Jango's origin, who the secessionists are, and a look into the several different types of battle droids. However, when I say tidbits, I mean just that- no more than a sentence or two. But it's still kinda cool ;)I'd recommend this book to anyone that enjoyed

We see, close-up, the meltproof Ceramoid mesh of a scout's pack; the traditional Ansata pattern on Jedi Jocasta Nu's tunic, symbolizing knowledge and learning; and the alarming features of Poggle the Lesser, ruler of the Stalgasin hive colony of Geonosians.
