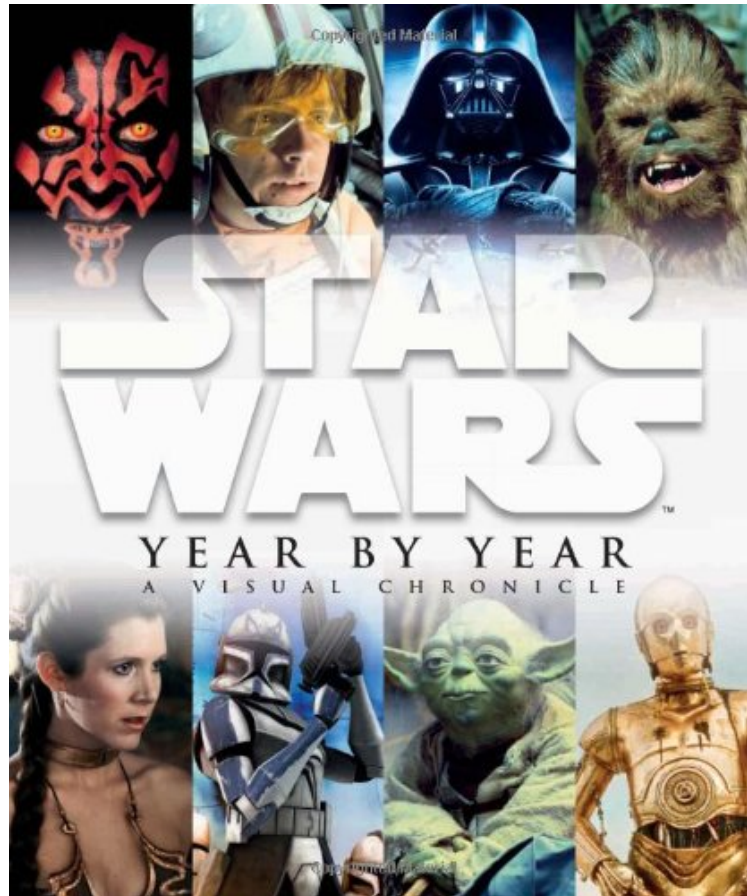

With so many new Star Wars books published each year, it sometimes becomes apparent they're running out of ideas and are recycling the same stuff and including a couple of pieces of new material to entice fans to buy. This book is not the case, it's very unique and pays off brilliantly. I highly doubt there is a Star Wars fan no matter how hardcore who will not find a ton of new, insightful information about this franchise.
