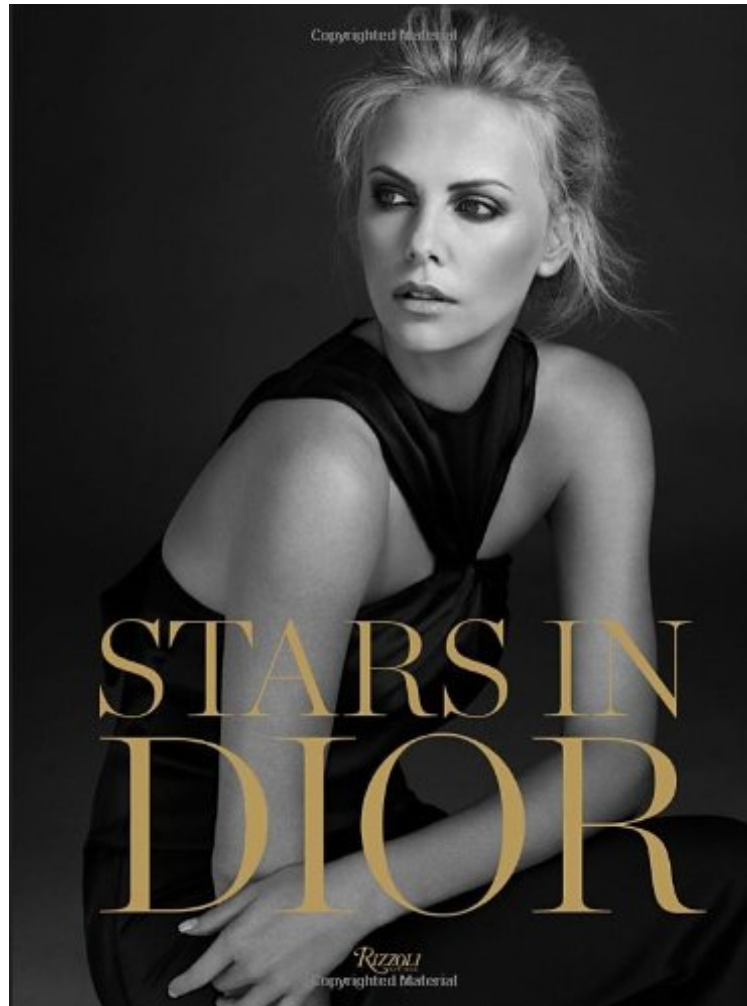

Also the inclusion of some archival advertisements for classical movies and theatrical plays where Dior garments were featured is a nice bonus.All in all the book is an attractive addition to any fashion collection.
