But I often forget I was able to "catch up", so to speak, a few years ago by listening to the two-CD collections from the WWDTM archives that were released by Highbridge Audio. It's been a while, but this is the newest release and some of these shows are hilarious. I'm not sure how they get the big names they do, but there are some heavy hitters this time. A few were new to me but I think you recognize names like Al Gore, Martha Stewart, Olympian track star Jackie Joyner-Kersey, and Bonnie Raitt. And, I'll bet "dollars to donuts" (a phrase you just might hear from one of the three rotating panelists - nearly all humorists like Tom Bodett or Paula Poundstone) that you will break out laughing at least a half-dozen times during the 14 "segments" included on this set. Each 10 minute segment starts with an interview with the "celebrity guest" and we learn lots of neat info because host Peter Segal doesn't shy away from asking questions. Wait'll you hear Martha Stewart's reply to what to do with a can of Spam or when Segal

asks Melinda Gates (Bill's wife, in case you didn't know) about family planning. Then the guest has to guess the answer to three multiple choice questions in categories related to them in some way. For example, Jeff Bridges (after discussing his film career) has to answer questions relating to the book/film "The Bridges of Madison County". Well, you get the idea. The segments are from shows that aired in 2012 and 2013. There's 2 hours of entertainment on this volume and most of it's hilarious! BTW, lists this as 120 pages.
